There is a large accessible garden with a patio for people to enjoy outdoors when the weather is good.

Life at the Royd is suitable for people with mental health conditions and complex needs. We are ready to welcome individuals of any age and gender to The Royd. People choose how they spend their time, enjoying individual hobbies and interests.



We understand that mental health conditions are often complex and long term and we work with each individual and their families or support network to plan their personalised journey to recovery.

We focus on providing tailored support plans that are individually tailored to each person's specific needs. Everyone is encouraged to be independent and play an active role in their recovery.

At The Royd, we're fortunate to be located in Handsworth Wood, a lovely residential area in North West Birmingham which is known for its large number of Victorian houses. The area has great access to parks such as Handsworth Park, local golf clubs and Sandwell Valley Country Park.
